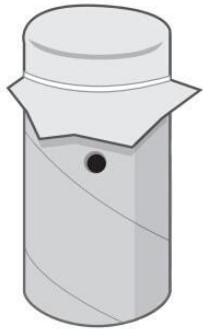
MAKE YOUR OWN KAZOO!

The Lima Symphony musicians play all kinds of instruments. We play violins, french horns, flutes and drums! But one fun instrument that we have never had on our stage is the kazoo.

Would you like to make one?

YOU WILL NEED:

- Toilet paper roll
- Markers, Crayons, Stickers, etc.
- Hole punch
- Wax paper
- Ruler
- Rubber band



DIRECTIONS:

1. Decorate an empty **toilet paper roll** or paper towel roll with markers, paint, tissue paper, or whatever you like.
2. On one end of the tube, use a **hole punch** to make a hole about an inch from the top (see picture to the left).
3. On the same end, wrap a 4x4" square of **wax paper** over the end of the tube.
4. Use a **rubber band** to hold the wax paper in place.

Make sure the paper is tight, or your kazoo won't sound good.

NOW PLAY!

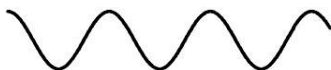
On the open end, say "la la laaaa" to test your kazoo.
What a fun sound!

Can you sing your favorite song?
Can you sound like a siren?
What happens if you cover the hole?
What happens if you whisper?

What do you say when a kazoo sneezes?
Kazoontite!

Knock knock.

Kazoo.
Kazoo who?
Kazoo please play me a song?
